

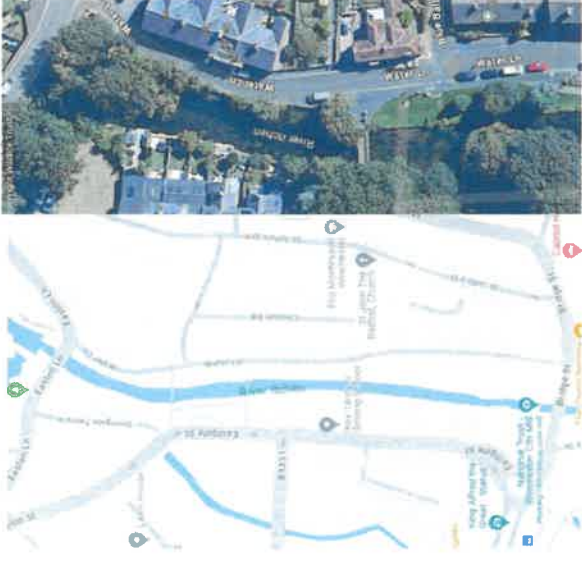

Overhanging branches, wooden bank protectors	All Risk of injury or capsizing, or entrapment of person or watercraft.	Downed tree or other obstructions present a safety hazard for paddlers and should be treated with extreme caution with special care to avoid damaging eyes. 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Hypothermia / Hyperthermia	All	Participants to wear clothing appropriate to the weather on the day.	Ensure paddlers wear appropriate clothing for conditions Special attention should be taken after immersion Advice given to ensuring adequate fluids are drunk.
